Pastors Minute Ps. Tony Riches

Following Covid 19 lockdowns around the world there has been a drop in church attendance of 15%. I think



it's worse than that. Where is everyone? We ask... what can be done? But first - there are 4 Shepherd types. Jeremiah mentions Shepherds 17 times. Israel needed shepherds. The ones they had were not what God intended them to be. They were showmen without the heart that God had for His people. If you say with *Ps. 23 The LORD is MY Shepherd*, then this is for you.

- #1.- Dangerous shepherds *Jer. 23:1 "Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of My pasture!"* says the Lord. These Shepherds like their authority but not their responsibility. They love attention, not people.
- #2. **Hired hands** i.e. Shepherds whose hearts are "in it for the money". John 10: 12 But a hireling, he who is not the shepherd, one who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees. Shepherds who are more interested in their Vacation than their Vocation.
- #3. **Promised Shepherds** *Back to Jer. 23: 4 I will set up shepherds over them who will feed them; ..." says the Lord.* These shepherds are those with a real and living relationship with God and His love drives them in all they do. These are sent by Jesus for the care of His sheep. He cares <u>all the time</u>.
- #4. The Chief SHEPHERD Jesus! One like no other. We answer to Him. John 10:14 I am the good shepherd; and I know My sheep, and am known by My own. We are not called on to suffer like He did but we do make sacrifices both in the Church setting and outside of it. We must seek Him daily.

Q? What can todays' faithful Post Covid Shepherds do?

- 1. Don't worry—instead PRAY 1 Peter 5:6-8
- 2. **Do** visit, follow up, call, and connect once, even twice but don't try too hard. If they are truly Gods' sheep they will soon be looking for their flock.
- 3. **Don't** blame yourself You weren't promised numbers. That's Gods' call.
- 4. **Do** Reach out those empty seats might just be ready for new people!
- 5. **Keep** –looking up 1 Peter 5:4 and when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that does not fade away.
 - 1 Peter 5:6 Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time, ⁷ casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you.

SCIYP Solid Chaplaincy Indig. Youth Program

SCIYP is back on the road again. Thank GOD!

Tony and Francine Riches were able to visit the top end again for 2 wks. ministry among the churches and families who are battling. They spent time with people who have experienced suicide and thoughts of suicide. In the past 2 years there has been only \$200 donated to support this vital outreach. The Kimberley has lost 3 Key leaders in recent years and a Pastor also left. This makes it even more isolated and finding good, confidential counselling has become very hard.

SCIYP has the links and connections to help families as they face the challenges of drug and alcohol affected individuals and communities with the message of hope in Christ. He is a comforter and strength. He is a Saviour who we need now more than ever, His Name is Jesus! Some people seek other ways and means to deal with their grief and this often makes things worse. In the outback there is more openness to the message of the gospel than we sometimes see in the cities.

One highlight of this trip was time spent in prayer in front of the local shop with a young man who has been struggling with suicidal thoughts and voices. He had left rehab early and was really battling. As the prayer was offered he began to visibly relax and went home and felt a new peace and fell asleep. We supported families at 3 funerals in a week. Grief is everywhere. Please Pray.
